








## A Newsletter of Inspiration from Women@NJPAC

Governor Phil Murphy and First
Lady Tammy Murphy, NJPAC
embarked on a new initiative this
past June: the North to Shore
Festival, a three-weekend, threecity festival of arts and
technology that brought more
than 300 performances,
workshops, conversations and

more to Atlantic City, Asbury Park and Newark. And so much of the excitement of the Festival, which drew hundreds of thousands of visitors, was focused on the women who took the stage! Pop superstar and Jersey girl Halsey raised the roof of Prudential Hall with a show of her hits reorchestrated to be played with a string ensemble. (In addition to talking about how meaningful both New Jersey and NJPAC were to her during the concert, **Halsey** warmed our hearts by releasing photos of her rehearsing at the hall with her toddler in her arms!) Other Festival's leading ladies included Alanis Morissette, Jazmine Sullivan, Marisa Monte, Demi Lovato and Natalie Merchant. Women@NJPAC President Faith Taylor was featured at a TechUnited conference event featuring executive changemakers, where she talked about her years-long crusade to develop Environmental Social Governance policies at Wyndham Worldwide. TechUnited also honored Faith as a Catalyst Award winner for her work empowering communities in the fields of the arts, climate change and human rights. And to top it all off, Women@NJPAC hosted a cocktail hour during the conference, in the Ryan Gallery, overlooking all the excitement happening in Newark during the North to Shore Festival!

leader. A co-founder of the influential public relations and events firm
Evergreen Partners, Mindy worked as a consultant for both NJPAC and the
New Jersey Symphony and served on the Board of WBGO. As a consultant,
she helped coordinate the *Spring Luncheon & Auction* and the *Gala* for NJPAC
for decades — and when she retired, she joined the Women@NJPAC and the
NJPAC Boards. "NJPAC was always my favorite client, I knew I couldn't give it
up. My husband knew when he married me, he was marrying NJPAC as well,"
Mindy says. The *Gala* is "so much a family event in a lot of ways, because so
many people who've known each other for so many years always come, and
it's wonderful to celebrate with them." On top of all that, this year Mindy and
her husband **David Bershad** made a \$1 million gift to the NJPAC Capital
Campaign; the Arts Center's box office will be renamed in their honor, in
recognition of their philanthropy.

"We wanted to do something that would make a real difference — and maybe inspire others to do the same," Mindy says. We salute this indefatigable and generous member of our sisterhood!
