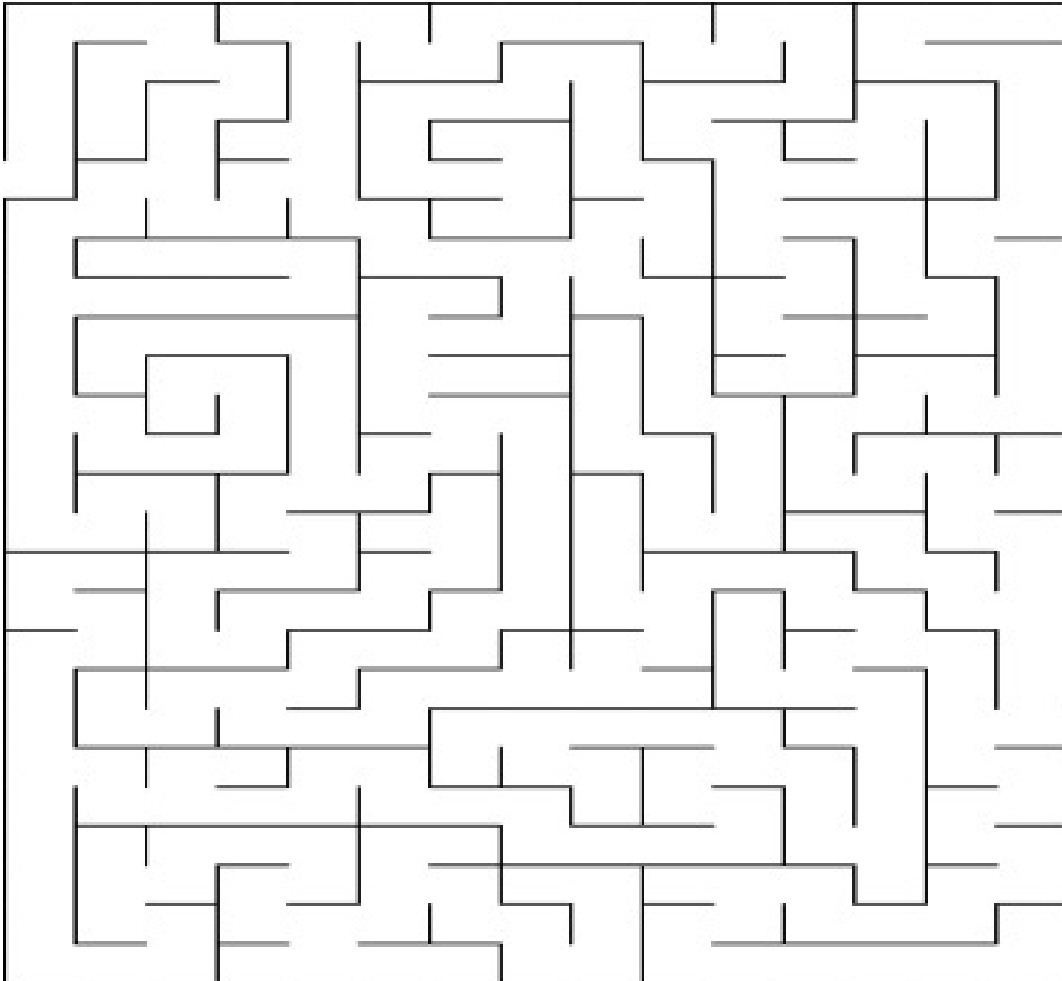

Physical Challenge


