Wincey Terry-Bryant, Creator, writer, producer, narrator, is an international recording artist and NJ native. Terry-Bryant has worked with music industry giants such as Sting, Tina Turner and Tom Jones. Terry-Bryant's voice can be heard as a featured vocal on Monie Love's hit single "It's a Shame," as well as the famed children's series Sesame Street. Television credits include Soul Train and The Cosby Show. Terry-Bryant is a resident teaching artist for the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, a presenter of assembly programs for Arts Horizons, a master professional development trainer for National Wolf Trap Early Childhood Education. Terry-Bryant is also the CEO of Winceyco LLC, executive director of NanaBabies

nonprofit organization and arts director of the New Jersey Coalition Against Human Trafficking. In addition, Terry-Bryant is the author and producer of inspirational music projects, educational CDs, DVDs and children's books.

Amy Erlanger, Citizenship Rock, is most known for her roles in the production of Kids and Yiddish at The National Yiddish Theatre Folksbiene, and for her awards for doing radio broadcasting with children. These days, you can find her teaching afterschool theater at Hunter College Elementary School, being an intern at Don't Tell Mama and singing in the Yiddish Philharmonic Chorus.

Briggitte D. White, Music & Crew Manager, holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in elementary education from William Paterson University, and a Master of Education dearee in administration and supervision from Cheyney University in Cheyney, Pennsylvania. White taught third, fourth and eighth grade for 14 years before becoming a school administrator. White served in the role as a building principal for 16 years. White worked part time for Winceyco for 10 years. In 2013, she was promoted to director of programs and E=events. In her fulltime current position, White is responsible for fiscal reporting, booking performances, venues and managing vendor relationships.

Chelsea Andell, *Fairness Rock*, grew up in Trinidad and Tobago, and has been performing since age five. Andell is a professional dancer, actress, rap artist,

choreographer, musician, songwriter, performer and co-director of the Candice Clarke Academy of Dance. Andell araduated from the New York Film Academy, where she received a degree for acting for film. Andell then trained with the Alvin Ailey Extension and at the Candice Clarke Academy of Dance. Andell is trained in multiple dances styles such as ballet, tap, contemporary, Creola, hip hop, jazz, folk, African dance and afrobeat. Andell has worked with Indasoul Entertainment in Los Angeles and Attic Studios in New York City to produce her original singles and music videos, which she also directed and starred in. As a dancer, Andell has choreographed over 18 dances, and toured in California, New York. Canada, Trinidad and Jamaica. Andell has acted in multiple feature and short films including Bathroom Planet as Sonne, Ice Dealer as Chelly and in The C.O.R.E. Workout.

Clifford Kee, Bassist, is a New Jersey native and began playing bass as a teenager. His musical inspirations include great bassists such as Jaco Pastorius, Victor Wooten and Sharay Reed. Kee has shared the stage with great artists such as Dottie Peoples, Andra Day, Gene Noble and Yummy Bingham.

James "Whoop" Coley Jr., Drummer and Music Director, is a professional drummer and graduate of the Rosa L. Parks School of Fine and Performing Arts in Paterson, NJ. Coley was selected to participate in the Jazz for Teens program at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in 2000. Coley's industry credits include playing for Fred Hammond,

Israel Houghton, Fantasia and Marvin Winans. Community and tristate area projects include the annual African American and Dominican parades and Jazz in the Park. Coley is a veteran drum instructor, the managing director of Sha'terra Memorial Daycare in Paterson, NJ; and the music director for International Bible Way Worldwide. Coley has been working with Winceyco since 2012.

Juan Ortiz, Respect Rock, is a Colombian actor, dancer and writer based in New York City. Over the past year, he's been performing in educational plays such as Culturally Cool and Count Me In. directed by Wincey Terry-Bryant), as well as films such as The Eternal Night, directed by Coco Fusco and short films like Happy Feet, directed by Andrés Goldzsmidt no, it was not the one about penguins dancing. Most recently, Cruz wrote and choreographed Good-Bye, a short film that was an official selection to the Lee Strasberg Film Festival. Back in Colombia, Cruz had a recurring role in the TV series Nadie Me Quita Lo Bailao broadcasted on RCN, one of Colombia's most extensive television networks. Fun facts about him? Sure. She is also a L'Oreal model and has appeared in several commercials and print ads for their products.

Michael Parker, Keyboardist and Co-Music Director, is a native of Paterson, NJ, where he araduated from Rosa L. Parks School of Fine and Performing Arts. Parker began his musical journey playing the drums for his local church but was always drawn the piano and organ. Gospel music gave him a solid foundation enabling him to transition into other genres. For the last 35 years, Parker has expanded his musical repertoire to include gospel, jazz, R&B funk, rock and pop, etc. Currently he can be found performing in NYC clubs and in local venues all over the east coast. Parker has played for the likes of Vivian Green, Groove Theory, Allison Williams, John P. Kee, Fred Hammond, Jodeci and many more. Sean Terry, *Prop Master*, is a graduate of St. Peters University in Jersey City, NJ. After studying audio sound engineering at SAE in Los Angeles, California, Terry returned to New Jersey to act as lead engineer on Wincey Terry-Bryant's debut album *Time to Say*. Over the years, Terry has been a key man to the Winceyco operation, executing myriad roles including actor, lead sound engineer and production assistant.

Sharell Williams, Carly, is a 2021 Circle in the Square Theatre School graduate hailing from Tampa, Florida. She has been studying acting since 2014 and is a member of SAG-AFTRA.
