he comforts me when I am sad.

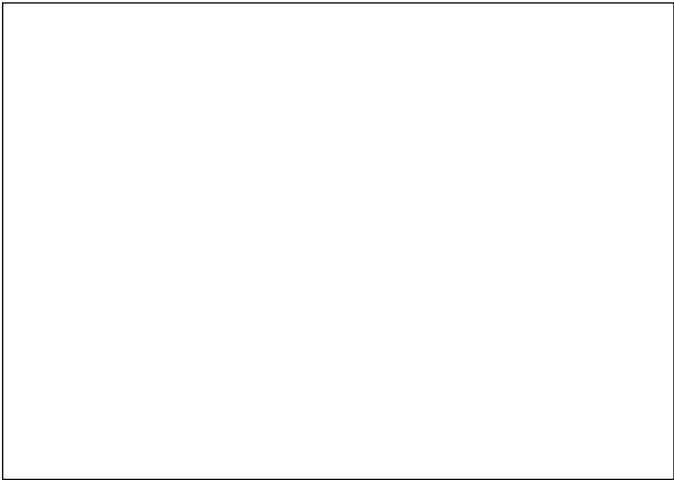
